
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
How to Use this Product


Preparation: Print cards on cardstock and laminate for durability. Cut cards apart prior to providing to students. Envelopes are a great way to store these cards.

Directions: Put students into pairs or groups. Have them work together to sort the cards into sets that represent the same rectangle. As students work, walk around and encourage discussion. Students should have eight sets of four cards upon completing the activity correctly. Once cards have been used in a lesson, you can also put them into a math station as a memory-style matching game, or (if desired) students can attach sets to construction paper (or use velcro dots on the back to make this reuseable) to turn in as an assessment.
